I heard about OLLI at UNLV from my friend Steve. He

and his wife and I have been friends for years, and he was taking classes here at OLLI. He told me about it and I said, sure. I began taking a class he was teaching and I really liked it and I started taking other classes and I've enjoyed it. By 2017, I actually started teaching with Steve, and we team taught for a number of semesters. I just really enjoyed it. The class we taught was called Staying Young as Old as You Can, and it was about 4 or 5 different areas of the world where people are living longer than one might expect. The question we asked was "what are they doing?" In these 5 areas of the world, why are people living statistically longer than we are here in the United States, or in other

parts of the world. We discussed several different characteristics that are common to all 5 areas. Each area has its little particular way about them but there are 9 different aspects that are important for us to live longer. We introduced those aspects to the people in our class and they seem to really like it.

More recently, I was invited to serve on the educational programming committee. I worked for 30 years in the Clark County school district. I was a teacher, a school psychologist counselor, and then an administrator in the district. So, I kind of know a little bit about teaching and people and I felt I could really contribute, so why not join in? On the committee, I am helping to find areas where

OLLI can grow and expand in our class offerings, and I am helping to find people to teach classes that we are not currently offering.

Some of my favorite classes over the years include the Artist's Way and the Science of Natural Healing. These classes were amazing. I think I took the Artist's Way twice. I also really, really enjoyed teaching and enjoyed working with that buddy of mine with our class. I would really encourage people to join OLLI for two reasons. First is keeping the mind active, and second is connecting with people. I remember during those early days, a group of about 4 or 5 of us after class, we would end up walking just to get exercise.

Learning with Zoom

What is Zoom?

Zoom is a video conferencing platform that is highly recommended by the Osher Lifelong Learning Institutes National Resource Center and the National Association of Area Agencies on Aging. Zoom allows instructors to present their screens and host interactive discussions. While we continue to increase our in-person classes on the Paradise Campus and multiple satellite locations throughout the Las Vegas valley, Zoom classes are a great way to keep our members learning and connecting from home!

Equipment Needed:

At the most basic level, all you need to use Zoom is a telephone, such as a smartphone or landline. However, if you have access to a computer or mobile device you can use the full capabilities of Zoom. The following equipment will enhance your experience but is not necessary:

Web camera: A camera will increase your connection with your instructor and your peers by allowing you to see each other face-to-face. If you do not have access to a web camera, you will still be able to see the instructor.

Headset with a microphone: This will let you hear and be heard more clearly. This does not need to be fancy equipment; it can be the same as the headphones you might use with your phone.

Charger: Charging your device during class will ensure that you do not have an unexpected power outage interrupting your learning.

How to Join A Zoom Discussion Group:

You will receive a Zoom link for your upcoming OLLI at UNLV class(es) in your confirmation email, and in a reminder email 24 hours prior to class. Copy and paste that link into your web browser OR click on the link to enter the digital classroom. Every week the group meets, you will use the same link. A link will be emailed each week one day before your discussion group. A Zoom account isn't required to attend a discussion group, although it is recommended. Anyone can attend a class session using their laptop or desktop (Windows or Mac), tablet, or smartphone (iPhone or Android). If you haven't used Zoom before, leave about 15 minutes to set it up before your first use.

Need help connecting or troubleshooting?

Zoom hosts daily live training webinars, offers quick start guides, and provides answers to frequently asked questions via their Help Center: **support.zoom.us/hc**. The OLLI at UNLV administrative team is available during office hours at 702-774-6554.







While it may take some time to provide all of the resources, we invite you to partake in what we have now and in the future. For as long as you are a member, you will have access to this site and no longer have to create an account each semester.

Please join or renew by Sunday, May 15 to receive your account information before the semester begins. WEBSITE FAQS

Why can't I log in?

There could be many reasons but the most probable is that there is a problem with the password you are entering. The default password is your first initial, last initial and zip code (ex. AZ12345). To reset your password click Forgot Password and an email will be sent with instructions and a link to reset your password.

I added a class but I can't see it?

If you logged in successfully (as indicated by your name appearing in the top right corner) but you do not see the class you are looking for, you will need to click Site Home on the left side of the screen to view the complete list of classes.

Can I bookmark a course and access the course from the bookmark?

Yes, you may be asked to login but then you will be taken to the bookmarked page.


How do I edit my profile?




- A screen requesting your username and password should appear

ARCHITECTURE OF POWER: THE MUGHALS

The Mughal Architecture of the Indian Subcontinent and its Influence on British Colonial Architecture: the Mughals erected impressive buildings during their rule (1526-1857). They built impressive structures not only for utilitarian purposes but also to impress their subjects with their power, influence, and importance. The Taj Mahal is the best known example of Mughal architecture. Like the Mughals, the British considered grand imposing buildings essential to projecting power and maintaining control. During this course we will study Mughal monuments, and identify and examine their architectural elements. We will also examine how the British imperialists appropriated the elements of Mughal architectural style and culture to combine them with European architectural elements. They then erected their own buildings in order to seek legitimacy and pose as indigenous rulers and logical heirs to the great Mughals.

I JEAN GABIN: THE MAN WHO WAS FRANCE

During the 1930s, actor Jean Gabin starred in a cluster of films which have subsequently been classified as Poetic Realist. This film movement was aligned with the political climate of pre-war France known as the Popular Front, a broad coalition of people and political parties seeking to live up to the nation's ideals of Liberté, Egalité, Fraternité: Freedom, Equality, and Brotherhood. The groundbreaking Poetic Realist directors (Jean Renoir, Julien Duvivier and Marcel Carné) brought to the screen images of the marginalized and working classes in a new way, elevating their lives to the level of poetry. Characterized by its haunting and often tragic beauty, Poetic Realism was revolutionary, and it influenced international filmmakers for decades to come. Gabin was at the center of it all. Between 1936 and 1939 he had a meteoric rise to stardom and became the iconic face of the Popular Front. Powerful and charismatic, Gabin carried the hopes and dreams of a nation through his roles, and as fascism loomed on the horizon, he ultimately embodied its crushing disappointments as well. In this class we will discuss the key Poetic Realist films featuring Gabin, including the often-imitated film noir Pépé Le Moko and the anti-war masterpiece La Grande Illusion. You will discover how—whether he was playing a gangster or a factory worker, an army officer or a deserter—the great Jean Gabin became the face of France.

QUANTUM MECHANICS AND THE SUBMICROSCOPIC WORLD OF PHYSICS

At the start of the 20th century, physics seemed to have reached the end of the road apart from a few unsolved problems, such as what color an object glows when heated. These lead to the exploration of the submicroscopic world, which turned out to be very different from the world as we know it, even though it is what makes up our world. It is because it is so different from what one would expect, that the subject is fascinating. Amongst the strange phenomena are the uncertainty principle and quantum objects to have both wave and properties, normally mutually exclusive. This course is based on The Great Courses series by Benjamin Schumacher and the class time will be evenly divided between lecture and discussion. This course is aimed at non-scientists—it is the class participation which is the essential part of the workshop.

Instructor: Gail Knapp retired after teaching psychology for almost 40 years in a Michigan community college. She moved to Las Vegas to escape the snow and because she had fallen in love with the city during a regular summer visit for a conference about the topics in this class. It is that interest that sparked the creation of a skepticism course that has been part of the OLLI for the past nine years. This course has become particularly relevant because of the culture right now. Knapp's academic work includes earning psychology degrees from Stony Brook and Hofstra Universities in New York and a Ph.D. from Michigan State University. She passed the examinations to become a professionally registered parliamentarian twenty years ago, and she earned a J.D. and passed the Michigan bar at age 62. She has taught Topics in Psychology and Parliamentary Procedure courses and has served as a mentor and on the curriculum committee. She is on the OLLI Steering Council where she serves as the secretary.

A CULTURAL HISTORY OF THEATER

This class will look at theater history from the ancient Greeks through to the 20th century based on the principle that theater reflects the artistic, political, and philosophical forces in the society that created it. For example, the rise of avant-garde theater in the 20th century was a reaction to the horrors of World War I and World War II. Along with lecture and discussion, students will read excerpts from plays and view scenes from performances during class meetings.

Instructor: Ellen Royer earned her PhD in theater at the University of Oregon. During her coursework Ellen took a series of classes titled "Theater and Culture." These classes became the basis for the theater history textbook written by her instructor, A Cultural History of Theater, which is the basis of this course. Her research area of interest was in 20th Century avant-garde theater, which culminated in an opportunity to observe world renowned postmodern director, Robert Wilson, rehearse a production of Danton's Death at the Alley Theater in Houston. This led to the publication of an article about the actor's process in plays directed by Wilson's in Theater Topics, which was included in the textbook Acting Reconsidered: A Theoretical and Practical Guide. Ellen taught theater as a graduate assistant at the University of Oregon, as an adjunct at Mount Hood Community College, in Gresham, OR, and the University of Houston, Downtown, and as an assistant professor at University of Nebraska at Kearney.

Remember when your middle school teacher told you Haiku was a three line poem broken into 5 syllables, 7 syllables, and 5 syllables? Today, the short form poetry has expanded its horizons. While the rules may not be as stringent as they once were, this form of expression, which originated in Japan, is still just a few lines per poem. EINSTEIN'S RELATIVITY & THE QUANTUM REVOLUTION: MODERN PHYSICS FOR NON-SCIENTISTS PART III

This course is the third installment of a three-part series of courses based on the Great Courses series of the same title. The course has 24 lectures by Dr. Richard Wolfson. The first four classes will cover lectures 21 through 24 of the series. The last four classes will be dedicated to learning about the complexity of the man, Albert Einstein, via documentaries, videos and a movie. This course is specifically designed for people with very little background in physics and/or mathematics. There is almost no mathematics in this course because we are not proving any theories. Dr. Wolfson's goals, as well as the instructor's are aimed at understanding the basic concepts of Einstein's relativity and the quantum revolution not with theorems and proofs, but with everyday examples and layman's terms as well as with humor.

Neeman retired from teaching mathematics after 40 years in middle schools, high schools, colleges, and universities in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. She has written the mathematics curricula for three different school systems in New Jersey. She was also an assistant principal and guidance counselor.

IMPROVING INTERPERSONAL COMMUNICATION

Special attention will be given to obstacles to effective communication and to methods for revising behaviors which create these obstacles. This course is designed to help students recognize and avoid obstacles to effective communication with a combination of instruction, exercises and role-play.
